The Prime Minister said, he has spoken to Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and he is constantly in touch with the state government.

Byte-PM-Mahakumbh-Condolence

Deputy Chief Minister, Chowna Mein has said that, "Our youth are the future leaders, innovators, artists, and entrepreneurs of tomorrow. It is our collective responsibility to nurture their potential and empower them to take our state to new heights." Mein said this while inaugurating the 4th edition of the Arunachal Yuva Samanvay at Kombo Jirdin Village near Aalo on Tuesday. Addressing the gathering, Mein emphasized the importance of Arunachal's youth in shaping the future of the state. He added that we cannot imagine a Viksit Arunachal without engaging our youths. Highlighting the ongoing government initiatives for youth development, reiterated 2024-25 as the Year of Youth, as declared by the Government, aimed at directing the energy and enthusiasm of young people toward the growth and progress of the State.
