India Meteorological Department has predicted that light to moderate rainfall accompanied with thunderstorm, lightning is very likely to occur at few places over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura and Assam & Meghalaya tomorrow. In the daily weather bulletin, IMD said that dense to very dense fog conditions is likely to prevail during night or early morning hours in isolated pockets of Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura till January 14. IMD has also forecast the possibility of rain and snowfall in parts of Northwest India until tomorrow under the influence of a western disturbance and dense fog conditions are also likely to prevail in northern states during early morning and night hours till the 14th of this month. Delhi-NCR and its adjoining areas experienced light to moderate rainfall yesterday resulting in a fall of temperature in the national capital. Due to fog, trains and several flights were delayed.
