The death toll in the earthquake that struck the Nepal-Tibet border region has mounted to 126. Chinese official media Xinhua reported that 188 people were also injured after a powerful 7.1-magnitude earthquake in the region yesterday

morning. The epicenter was located at a depth of 10 kilometer in Tibet Autonomous Region, near the Nepal border. The earthquake also sent tremors across northern India, affecting areas such as Bihar, West Bengal, and Sikkim. No casualties or property damage has been reported in the country so far.
