The first meeting of the Joint Parliamentary Committee on two bills related to One Nation One Election was held today in New Delhi. The Bills are officially named as the Constitution (One Hundred and Twenty-Ninth Amendment) Bill, 2024 and Union Territories Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024. Talking to media, Committee Chairperson, BJP MP, PP Chaudhary said, as far as the procedure is concerned, the committee will make an effort to listen to all stakeholders be it legal experts, members of civil society or from judiciary, or political parties.

During the meeting, representatives of the Ministry of Law and Justice (Legislative Department) briefed the members on the provisions of the proposed laws. The 39 member committee has 27 Members from the Lok Sabha and 12 Members from the Rajya Sabha.



Union Minister of Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari has said that around 1.80 lakh deaths occurred due to road accidents in 2024. Addressing a press conference on road safety meeting with Transport Ministers of all States and Union Territories in New Delhi yesterday, Mr Gadkari mentioned that nearly 30 thousand people died because of not wearing a helmet.

He highlighted that a Cashless Treatment scheme for road accident victims was launched during the meeting. Mr Gadkari said that the Government under this scheme will provide maximum of upto 1.5 Lakhs rupees for treatment to

accident victims. Around 2 lakh rupees will be provided for the deceased in hitand-run cases.

Union Minister of Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari also announced a scheme for the pan-India setup of Driver Training Institutes (DTIs). The scheme will provide incentives for setting up DTIs and additional incentives for the integrated infrastructure of Automated Testing Stations and DTIs. He said that there is a lack of skilled drivers in the country and the government is committed to setting up more driving training centres in the country. Noting that road safety was the utmost priority in the meeting, Mr Gadkari said all kinds of issues, solutions, and steps were discussed to drive transformation in road and transport sector of the country.

underway to rescue the remaining labourers trapped inside the illegal rat-hole coal mine at Umrangso in Dima Hasao district. Army, Navy, National and State Disaster Response Forces, and other agencies are working continuously to rescue the trapped coal miners.

In weather, India Meteorological Department has forecast dense fog conditions are very likely to continue during night and early morning hours in isolated pockets Nagaland, Assam, Manipur, Mizoram, and Tripura till the 13th of this month. In Nagaland, the state capital Kohima is expected to witness a minimum temperature of 4 degree Celsius and maximum temperature of 20 degree Celsius tomorrow. Temperature in Dimapur is likely to range between 11 degree Celsius and 23 degree Celsius.
