Prime Minister Narendra Modi today emphasised that India operates with a spirit of development, not expansionism. He remarked that India has always supported an open, secure, inclusive, and prosperous Indo-Pacific Region. He was addressing the gathering after dedicating three frontline naval combatants INS Surat, INS Nilgiri and INS Vaghsheer to the nation on their commissioning at the Naval Dockyard in Mumbai.

The Prime Minister emphasized that it was also a matter of pride that all the three frontline platforms were made in India and congratulated all the stakeholders. Mr Modi remarked that, India has emerged as the first responder in the Indian Ocean Region. The Prime Minister also congratulated the armed forces for propelling the Make in India campaign.

Author and Publisher of the Morung Express, Aküm Longchari has emphasised the importance of authenticity in storytelling for journalists, writers and researchers in Nagaland. In a conversation held on his book "Pushing Boundaries" in Kohima today, Mr Longchari viewed that journalists should be self-conscious of the consequences their stories would impact the society, individuals and families. He pointed out that stories of war and conflict often attract more attention and sell better than those of peace. However, he emphasized that it is crucial for journalists to be responsible in how stories are told and the impact they have. He also said, understanding the power of information and narratives to shape opinions and policies is crucial and that when a journalist recognise this, peace lens becomes all more significant. Highlighting on the changing media landscape since the COVID-19 pandemic, Mr Longchari noted that the media environment has shifted drastically with the rise of news channels and influencers, making it increasingly difficult to distinguish between credible news organizations and others providing information. He pointed out that not all information provided by these platforms qualifies as news, stressing the importance of verifying sources. Mr Longchari also called for a broader effort to create awareness around media literacy, adding that the state need more hands-on journalism schools. For news-based organizations, all information is not news, one need to authenticate its source, he stressed, urging both journalists and consumers to be more discerning in how they consume and share information.

Separately, Mr Rio also interacted with the Nagaland Team who won silver at the 37th Senior National Tug-of-War. India Meteorological Department, IMD, has forecast ground frost conditions in isolated pockets of Nagaland and other Northeastern states during the next couple of days.
