Union Minister of State for Women and Child Development Savitri Thakur said that there is need for continued investment in Anganwadi centers to ensure comprehensive development for young children, particularly in rural and remote regions. She said this after visiting an Anganwadi centre in Upper Subansiri District of Arunachal Pradesh, yesterday. She said that early childhood care, nutrition and education are very important in building a strong foundation for the children. She called for collaboration and collective action to address the challenges faced by women and children in the region, and to ensure holistic development for all sections of society. The Union Minister is on a three-day tour to Arunachal Pradesh, which will end today.

Today is last date to withdraw the nomination for the 70-member Delhi Assembly election. A total of 719 candidates are in fray. The most number of 23 candidates are in New Delhi assembly constituency, while the lowest number of five candidate is on Patel Nagar and Kasturba Nagar. The Voting for the Delhi Assembly elections will be held on the 5th of next month and the counting will take place on the 8th.
