Prime Minister Narendra Modi today attended the annual National Cadet Corps (NCC) PM Rally at the Cariappa Parade Ground in New Delhi. The theme for this year's NCC PM Rally is 'Yuva Shakti, Viksit Bharat'. Addressing the event, Mr Modi highlighted the government's efforts towards removing many obstacles faced by the country's youth in the last 10 years. Noting that the NCC has constantly inspired youth of India towards nation-building, he expressed pride at the largest uniform youth organisation.

The Rally is witnessing participation by 144 young cadets from 18 friendly foreign countries. Besides, more than 650 volunteers from Mera Yuva Bharat, Education Ministry and Tribal Affairs from across the nation are attending the Rally as special guests.

Uttarakhand has become the first state to implement the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) to establish a uniform and equal set of rules on marriage, divorce, succession, and inheritance for all citizens, except scheduled tribes. It was implemented from today with the inauguration of the Rules and UCC-Portal by Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami in Dehradun. The UCC aims to standardize personal civil laws, ensuring equal rights for all citizens.



Chief Secretary of Nagaland, Dr. J. Alam, today called for efforts to boost the ongoing 100-day TB elimination campaign, emphasizing the need for early treatment and outreach programs. He was addressing the meeting of Administrative Heads of Departments and Heads of Departments at Secretariat Conference Hall in Kohima, which was also virtually attended by Deputy Commissioners (DCs) from the districts. Noting the ongoing campaign across the country, Dr. Alam highlighted the three target districts of Kohima, Mon, and Wokha in Nagaland. He asserted the need to give further impetus to make the campaign successful in the state.

Calling for intensive outreach and awareness initiatives, Dr. Alam asked the DCs to devise strategies and engage Civil Society and church organizations as well as individuals to achieve the targeted outcomes. During the meeting, the Chief Secretary administered the TB-Free India pledge.



Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio met with a group of State Government Advocates today. In a social media post, Mr Rio said the meeting discussed various issues and concerns related to the welfare of advocates. The Chief Minister urged them to continue putting forth their best efforts in representing the State Government.



Nagaland Police has received a total of 943 complaints through the 1930 Helpline for reporting cyber financial fraud since its inception in February 2022. Police said, an amount of eight crore, 84 Lakh, 20 thousand, 305 rupees have been reported to be defrauded, while One crore, 20 lakh, 91 thousand, 314 rupees has been frozen from 2006 accounts.

The 1930 - Citizen Financial Cyber Fraud Management and Reporting System is a helpline number operational in Nagaland since 1st February 2022. Victims of cyber financial fraud can call this helpline and report their complaint by giving details of the debited or credited accounts, amount of money lost and transaction details. On receiving the complaint, the Bank Account or e-wallets of the fraudsters can be frozen immediately, and legal mechanism for reimbursing the lien amount can be availed.)

Police has advised victims of cyber financial fraud to immediately call 1930 with their complaint, and also report to the nearest police station.



The state Health Department has extended the permissible reimbursement period for treatment tied to all CMHIS Government Employees and Pensioners. Reimbursement will now be permissible for treatment undergone between 1st November 2022 and 28th March 2024, which supersedes the previous period of 1st November 2022 to 31st December 2023. For claims, applications with supporting documents need to be uploaded on the Official portal at cmhis.nagaland.gov.in. The department has requested all concerned individuals to note the updated deadlines and comply with the relevant guidelines to ensure smooth processing of claims.



The Wokha District Committee for Lighthouse School under the NECTAR Project held a meeting today for stakeholder sensitization. The meeting centred on the upcoming construction of the Light House Complex. Joint Secretary and Deputy Project Director NEP - NECTAR, Avelü Ruho, highlighted the project's goal to enhance education quality in government schools, especially in rural areas. Government Higher Secondary School Wokha has been selected as a center of excellence under the project. Ruho also emphasized the need for civil society support in overcoming challenges during implementation. Meanwhile, Deputy Commissioner Vineet Kumar assured full administrative support for the project.



The Department of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources today installed more than 10 aquariums in Kiphire. This first-time initiative in the district is aimed at sensitizing importance of fish for health and as stress relievers. Speaking to Akashvani News, District Fishery Officer Nzanthung Yanthan said, the department has so far provided only domesticated fish like common carp, and will bring ornamental fishes soon. Mr Yanthan highlighted that the district has more than 40 species of ornamental fishes in the wild.



The inaugural season of the much-anticipated Nagaland Super League (NSL) will kick off tomorrow with thrilling matchups that promise to captivate football fans across the state. In the opening match, Barak Football Club will take on Nagaland United Sports Club at 6:15 PM in Chümoukedima Football Stadium, Police Complex. The match will commence after a grand inaugural ceremony. Fans can secure their tickets through official ticketing partner AHIBI.in.

And, in weather, India Meteorological Department has forecast likely rainfall activity in isolated places over Nagaland and its adjoining states from 29th of this month. It said, rain and thundershowers is likely to

continue till the end of the week. The weather body predicted that no significant change in minimum temperatures is likely over the region.
