The Indian Space Research Organisation, ISRO today scripted history by successfully completing docking of two satellites named Chaser and Target under the SpaDeX mission. With the stupendous success of the indigenously developed Bharatiya Docking System by ISRO, India has become the fourth country to use this technology after the USA, Russia and China. Docking technology is critical in assembling the space station and in crewed missions. It provides crucial facilities including in-orbit refueling and assembling heavy infrastructure in microgravity. ISRO Chairman Dr. V. Narayanan congratulated the team on the feat.



President Droupadi Murmu extended her wishes to ISRO and the entire scientists and engineers communities of the country for boosting India's space capabilities". In a social media post, the President said, this achievement paves the way for country's future endeavours in space exploration such as Chandrayaan-4, India's planned space station and Gaganyaan. Lauding the achievement, Prime Minister Narendra Modi in a social media post, said it is a significant stepping stone for the country's ambitious space missions in the years to come. Union Minister of State for Science and Technology, Dr. Jitendra Singh highlighted that it is an entirely indigenous Bharatiya Docking System.
