Prime Minister Narendra Modi distributed over 65 lakh property cards under the SVAMITVA Scheme to property owners through video conferencing today. The property cards have been distributed in over 50 thousand villages across ten states and two Union Territories. Speaking on the occasion, the Prime Minister termed this day historic for the rural economy. He said, over two crore 25 lakh property documents have been issued in the last five years since the implementation of SVAMITVA scheme.

While interacting with the beneficiries, Mr. Modi said, lack of proper property documents is a big problem which causes disputes. He said proper documentations of the property will facilitate getting loans from the banks, and protect from illegal encroachments.

The Prime Minister said, SVAMITVA scheme will make the rural economy the core pillar of development. He said, valid property documents will also make it easier to get a proper claim in case of a disaster.



The State Review Meeting was convened today to take stock of the States preparedness on HMPV and other Influenza like Illness such as Severe Acute Respiratory Illness (SARI). During the meeting, the State Nodal Officer for Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme presented an overview of the program preparedness and surveillance update of Outbreak Prone diseases in the State. Addressing the program, Commissioner & Secretary, Anoop Khinchi urged the District Surveillance Units to heighten surveillance and be vigilant on clustering of Influenza Like Illnesses and SARI. The meeting also highlighted on the Pan-India Mock Drill carried out in 663 Public and Private Health Units across the State for Preparedness and overall readiness to tackle any Public health event.



Nagaland Minister for Public Health Engineering Department and Cooperation, Jacob Zhimomi has highlighted the importance of supporting emerging entrepreneurs, saying that there is immense potential in entrepreneurship as means of economic growth. The Minister was speaking at the inauguration of Live Coffee Roastery unit of Juro Coffee House, in Chumoukedima yesterday. Mr. Zhimomi expressed happiness that Naga entrepreneurs today are pushing boundaries and setting the bar high, which is an extremely encouraging scene. He appreciated the Proprietor of Jüro Coffee House and Roastery, Searon Yanthan for going the extra mile and putting the Nagaland coffee scene on the global map. Mr. Zhimomi added that with a seamless and integrated coffee supply chain, the company is providing employment to Naga youth as well as meaningful income to the local coffee farmers.



Superintendent Engineer of Public Works Department (Mechanical), Ekon Murry has stressed on the importance of individuals acquiring digital skills to address the digital divide. Addressing the 5th conference of the Wokha Humtsoe Elumyo Senior Youth Welfare Forum in Wokha today, Mr. Murry highlighted that the digital divide is shaped by factors such as generational gaps and people residing in the rural areas are more affected by it. He noted that the divide became particularly evident during the COVID-19 pandemic, as education shifted to electronic platforms. Mr. Murry emphasized that many individuals faced challenges in accessing these facilities due to financial limitations or a lack of technological proficiency.
