The major projects inaugurated were the upgraded Lhou-Mukto Road to double-lane specifications over a stretch of 12.50 km and a Vivekananda Kendra Vidyalaya at Mukto. Khandu emphasized that he is committed to building a stronger, self-reliant Mukto. 'The meeting was also a special moment to celebrate the rich cultural heritage of Monpa society through a vibrant showcase,' he said. On the occasion, the CM also distributed Soil Health Cards and vegetable seed kits to the farmers.

Agriculture minister Gabriel D Wangsu has called for preserving the legacy of the state's unsung heroes. IMD has issued warning of rainfall with thunderstorms and lightning at isolated locations over the next 24 hours. Light snowfall is also forecasted at higher altitudes in Tawang, Dibang Valley, Upper Subansiri, Upper Siang, Shiyomi, and Tawang districts. Furthermore, shallow to moderate fog is likely to occur during the morning and night hours in isolated pockets of the state.
