The High-Level Committee, under the Chairmanship of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, has approved additional Central assistance of over one thousand 554 crore rupees from the Nation al Disaster Response Fund (NDRF) to five states, including Nagaland, affected by natural calamities such as floods, flash floods, landslides, and cyclonic storms during the past year. Over 170 crore has been approved for Nagaland, more than 288 crore rupees for Tripura 608, crore rupees for Andhra Pradesh, over 255 crore for Odisha, and more than 231 crore for Telangana. The Home Ministry said, this additional support is separate from the funds already allocated to the states by the Centre under the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF). During the financial year 2024-25, the Central government released more than 18 thousand 322 crore rupees to 27 states under the SDRF and over four thousand 808 crore rupees from the NDRF to 18 states.

Rural Development Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan has said, several revolutionary initiatives have been taken by the Central government to make the lives of rural citizens more comfortable. Highlighting initiatives like Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, Pradhan Mantri Grameen Sadak Yojana, Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam campaign, National Rural Livelihoods Mission, and Lakhpati Didi Yojana, Mr. Chouhan said, earlier India depended on other countries for food but today the country is not only self-reliant in food production but also helping other nations.

Department of Health & Family Welfare has informed on certain amendments made to the Food Safety and Standards (Prohibition and Restrictions on Sales) Regulations, 2011. The amendment removes two clauses which required manufacturers to obtain the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) Certification Mark for packaged drinking water and mineral water. Accordingly, Food Business Operators involved in the manufacture of water are no longer required to acquire the BIS Certification Mark. However, they must still obtain a mandatory Food Safety License Certificate through the online portal at www.foscos.fssai.gov.in, and also secure a water test report from a FSSAI Notified Laboratories. Further, the packaged water must clearly display key details on the label, such as product name, name and address of manufacturer, Date of processing and Best before date, among others.

Gyanesh Kumar today assumed charge as the new Chief Election Commissioner at Nirvachan Sadan in New Delhi. Mr Kumar succeeds Rajiv Kumar who completed his tenure yesterday. In his message after assuming charge, Mr Kumar said, the first step for nation building is voting and every citizen of India who has completed 18 years of age should become an elector and always vote.

Before his elevation as CEC, Mr Kumar was an Election Commissioner since the 15th of March last year.

Department of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources, Peren organized A one-day workshop on "Entrepreneurship Development in Commercialization of Common Carp Breeding" at Ramdi Thou Farm, Mhainamtsi, Jalukie today. The workshop aimed to empower fish farmers by providing knowledge and skills on how to successfully breed Common Carp. The department highlighted the

potential of Common Carp breeding in enhancing employment opportunities for rural and marginalized communities, as well as food security and nutrition by increasing availability of protein-rich fish. During the workshop, farmers were sensitized on National Fisheries Digital Platform, Pradhan Mantri Matsya Kisan Samridhi Sah Yojana, and Kissan Credit Card Scheme. The training also included demonstration on preparation of fish feeds. Altogether, 13 fish farmers from Jalukie Block attended the workshop.

A five-member Indian delegation, including two from Nagaland recently visited New Zealand to strengthen cooperation in kiwifruit development. The representatives from Nagaland included Horticulture Director Meyasashi, and Joint Director S. Senka. The visit was organized by the New Zealand Embassy in Delhi as part of the roadmap and strategy for developing kiwifruit industry in India, in collaboration with Zespri International Limited, New Zealand. During the visit, the delegation engaged in extensive discussions with key stakeholders in Auckland, New Zealand, and visited multiple kiwifruit orchards, export packhouses, and nurseries to gain insights into best practices in cultivation, post-harvest management, and export procedures. Nagaland, being the second-largest kiwifruit producing state in India, stands to benefit significantly from international collaborations, especially with New Zealand, the world's leading producer and exporter of Kiwifruit.
