Prime Minister Narendra Modi and French President Emmanuel Macron discussed all aspects of the India-France strategic partnership and reviewed cooperation in the strategic areas of defence, civil nuclear energy, and space. During their bilateral talks yesterday, both leaders reaffirmed their strong commitment to the India-France Strategic Partnership. In a special gesture, Prime Minister Modi and President Macron flew together from Paris to Marseille in the French Presidential Aircraft. They discussed the full spectrum of bilateral relations, and key global and regional issues. This was followed by delegation-level talks after arrival in Marseille. Both leaders discussed ways to strengthen collaboration in the fields of Technology and Innovation, enhancing trade and investment ties. Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri today briefed media in Marseille.

Prime Minister and President Macron expressed satisfaction at the ongoing collaboration in the fields of health, culture, tourism, education, and people-to-people ties. They committed to further deepening engagement in the Indo-Pacific and in global forums and initiatives.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi and French President Emmanuel Macron jointly inaugurated the first Indian consulate in the historic French city of Marseille this afternoon. Earlier in the

day, the two leaders interacted with members of the Indian diaspora in the city. They also paid tribute to Indian soldiers who sacrificed their lives during the First and Second World Wars at the Mazargues War Cemetery. Mr. Modi, along with the French president, reached Marseille this morning after concluding a series of high-level engagements in Paris. The Indian community in Marseille gave them a warm and enthusiastic welcome on their arrival. After wrapping up his visit in France, Prime Minister Modi departed for a two-day visit to the United States at the invitation of President Donald Trump.

Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio today paid tribute to the unwavering dedication of ex-servicemen and Veer Naris, and reaffirmed the government's continued support. He was addressing the Mega Ex-Servicemen Rally for veterans of the Armed Forces and Assam Rifles at Dimapur. Mr Rio acknowledged their critical role in the nation's security and development.

Highlighting various government schemes, Mr Rio encouraged them to avail benefits of initiatives such as CM's Micro Finance Initiative, and called on banks to extend all financial services to veterans and their families. The Chief Minister also recognized challenges faced by Veer Naris and war widows, and pledged his government's support to empower them through skill development programs and financial assistance. The Reserve Bank of India has advised all agency banks to keep all their branches dealing with government business open on March 31. This has been done following the Centre's request to process all government transactions relating to receipts and payments in the financial year 2024-25 itself.



The Zunheboto unit of National Tobacco Control Programme today initiated a full scale checking of prohibited tobacco products, primarily focusing on areas near educational institutions. The drive was carried under COPTA 2003, in collaboration with District Administration officials led by EAC Tsoinchu Sangtam, along with Dobashis, Police personnel, Officials from Zunheboto Range Students' Union, Sumi Youth Organisation and No Tobacco Club Zunheboto. The seized products were later disposed off.
