The toppers from prestigious exams like UPSC, IIT-JEE, CBSE, and ICSE today shared their success stories in the 8th and final episode of Pariksha Pe Charcha 2025. Earlier, the Deputy Commissioners' Conference was held from 16 to 17 January last. The conference focused on six themes - Swasth Arunachal, Shikshit Arunachal, Samriddh Arunachal, Surakshit Arunachal, Swachh Arunachal, and Sundar Arunachal, and four special sessions on forest clearance, land acquisition, saturation of the schemes and the role of quardian ministers and mentor secretaries. This report will help the Deputy Commissioners take timely action on the theme areas, which will be quarterly reviewed by the Chief Secretary. Concerted action and review will help in the timely completion of the projects and foster the growth and development of the State, stated a release.

In its continued fight against inter-state drug trafficking, the Banderdewa Police Team led by SDPO Naharlagun, Rishi Longdo, conducted a house search at Niya Colony, Banderdewa yesterday and recovered three pouches containing suspected heroin, weighing 34.72 grams. The operation was carried out under the supervision of SP, Naharlagun, Mihin Gambo. Following the recovery of the suspected contraband, the accused was immediately arrested, and a case was registered under the NDPS Act. In the meantime, SP, Naharlagun, Mihin Gambo, has lauded the Banderdewa Police Team for their exemplary work in busting the narcotics racket.

The 38th Battalion of SSB, Tawang successfully conducted a veterinary camp under the Civic Action Programme in Mogto and Serjong villages in Tawang today. The camp was organized under the supervision of 2iC SSB, Dr. Sudhir Sangma and EAC of Jang, Dr. Honjon Perme. A total of 34 livestock and pet owners were provided essential veterinary services in the camp.

As part of the initiative, livestock owners were also educated on Foot and Mouth Disease, Lumpy Skin Disease, Rabies and Tickborne protozoan diseases. This initiative reflects SSB's commitment to community welfare and its continuous efforts to support local populations through healthcare and awareness programs.
