Lok Sabha MP S Supongmeren Jamir has criticized the central government for not addressing the two key agreements related to the Naga political issue—the Framework Agreement of 2015 and the Agreed Position of 2017. Speaking during the discussion on the motion of thanks to the President's address in the Lok Sabha yesterday, Mr. Jamir emphasized that the people of Nagaland do not want any more bloodshed and urged the Government of India to take concrete steps toward implementing the agreements. He highlighted the presence of 26 factions in the state and pointed out the issue of rampant taxation, claiming that such conditions hinder the economic progress of Nagaland.

Mr. Jamir also raised concerns about corruption in the state, questioning whether the state government, the Government of India, or Naga political groups were to blame. He also criticized the President's speech for failing to acknowledge the diversity of traditions, cultures, customs, and religions in the country. Mr. Jamir stressed that Indian identity should be rooted in secularism. He also called for the urgent upgradation of Nagaland University, which has been in existence for 31 years, including improvements in sports infrastructure, to address the state's infrastructure challenges.

VOICE BYTE: Extensive arrangements are in place to ensure free and fair elections in the National capital. A total of 13 thousand seven hundred sixty six polling booths have been set-up across the 70 assembly constituency. The election commission has deployed more than 1.8 lakh polling personnel to ensure smooth conduct of voting. Over 83 lakh male, around 72 lakh female and 1 thousand two hundred 67 third gender voters are expected to exercise their franchise. In this election 783 voters are above 100 years of age.
