Commissioner & Secretary to Government of Nagaland, Kesonyu Yhome, has emphasized the state government's commitment to ensuring the timely completion of the Foothill Road with high-quality workmanship. In a press statement, Mr. Yhome stated that the state government has consistently prioritized the construction of the Foothill Road, allocating significant funds over the years, including 148.50 crore rupees in the 2023-24 fiscal year. He said, despite delays due to lack of central funding, the state government has also worked to improve relations with Assam, facilitating progress. Informing that the project is 100 per cent government-funded, Mr Yhome assured that all necessary terms and conditions, including quality specifications, timelines, and contractor obligations, are clearly outlined in the official contract agreement between the Public Works Department (R&B) and the contractors. He therefore, said there is no need for contractors to enter into additional agreements with third parties, including the Nagaland Foothill Road Coordination Committee (NFHRCC). While acknowledging the NFHRCC's noble intentions to ensure quality and timely completion, the Commissioner clarified that third-party agreements are not mandatory for a project fully funded by the government. He also stated that no agency should impose its terms on the state government, as the government is fully aware of the urgency and gravity of the matter. Mr. Yhome reiterated that the state government's policy has always been to request communities to contribute to development by donating land for the Right of Way in road projects. He emphasized that the same goodwill and cooperation are being sought from local communities for the Foothill Road project. Mr. Yhome further stressed that the department remains committed to open dialogue and urged all parties to directly approach the department to address concerns, rather than taking them to the media. Noting the urgency to begin work without further delay due to the approaching monsoon season, the Commissioner & Secretary, on behalf of the government, urged all stakeholders to extend their full support and cooperation to ensure the immediate commencement and timely completion of this critical project."
