Prime Minister Narendra Modi has underscored the importance of education, highlighting that it is meant for holistic development. He made these remarks while interacting with students during the eighth edition of the 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' in New Delhi. The Prime Minister addressed students on how to overcome stress and anxiety during exams. During the interaction, Mr Modi advised students not to remain confined within walls, and emphasised that for growth, students need the freedom to explore their passions. He noted that students should engage in their favourite activities to perform well in exams. The Prime Minister advised students to develop a habit of writing. He highlighted

the importance of nutrition and sleep, and also encouraged students to spend time in the morning sun.

Mr Modi also gave tips to students on mastering pressure, and advised students to prepare without stressing and to keep challenging themselves.



Joining the rest of the nation, students in Nagaland today viewed ‘Pariksha Pe Charcha’ at their respective schools. At Kohima, Commissioner and Secretary for School Education and SCERT Nagaland, Kevileno Angami, and other officials from the education department viewed the live streaming at Dr. Neilhouzhü Kire Government Higher Secondary School. Highlighting the significance of the program, Ms Angami emphasized that the core issues raised were relevant to all students, and encouraged the students to prepare themselves not just for exams but also for the challenges ahead in life.

Students from schools shared their experiences following the program and said it was inspiring.



Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE) is all set to conduct the High School Leaving Certificate (HSLC) and Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate (HSSLC) examination 2025. The HSLC Exam will commence from 12th February and end on 24th February. A total of 23 thousand 267 students, including 957 compartmental candidates will sit for the matric exam in 97 centers across the State. The HSSLC examination will begin tomorrow in 68 centers where a total of 17 thousand 194 candidates, including 546 compartmental candidates will be appearing across the different streams. Simultaneously, Class 11 Promotion Examination will be conducted from tomorrow till 7th March. A total of 18 thousand 375 students

across all the streams of Arts, Commerce and Science will appear for the exam in 192 institutions. Meanwhile, various students organizations have appealed to the Power Department and authorities concerned to ensure uninterrupted power supply throughout the examination period.



Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio has extended best wishes to all the students who will be taking the HSLC and HSSLC exams. In a social media post, he hoped that their dedication, hard work, and focus may bring great success, and also prayed for their good health and peace. Mr Rio also conveyed best wishes to the NBSE for smooth conduct of the exams.



Meluri will officially be inaugurated as Nagaland's 17th district on the 21st of February. This was informed by Advisor for New & Renewable Energy, NSDMA, Z. Nyusietho Nyuthe during the monthly Phek District Planning and Development Board meeting today. The inauguration will take place at Meluri District Headquarter. Minister Parliamentary Affairs KG Kenye expressed appreciation for Meluri's elevation to a full-fledged district.

The state Power Department has informed that the 220 kilovolt single-circuit New Kohima-Mokokchung transmission line will be test charged at its rated voltage at 11 AM on February 12 and will remain charged thereafter. Executive Engineer, Transmission Division, Kohima, Namheu Khate Zeliang, urged the public to avoid touching or going near the transmission line for safety reasons. Mr Zeliang cautioned that anybody who does so will be doing at their own risk, and the department will not be held responsible for any untoward incidents that may occur.
