President Droupadi Murmu inaugurated the Aadi Mahotsav 2025 in New Delhi today. Addressing the gathering, President Murmu said the traditions and way of living of tribal people in the country enrich the culture of the nation. She said allocation for tribal welfare has increased three fold in this year's Budget. The President asserted that the country will become developed only if the tribal societies are uplifted.

Aadi Mahotsav aims to celebrate and showcase the vibrant culture, heritage and economic potential of India's tribal communities. The festival will bring together over 600 tribal artisans, 500 performing artists, and 25 tribal food stalls, representing the diverse traditions of more than 30 states and Union Territories.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that India's cultural diversity is reflected in the textiles originating from different parts of the country. Addressing the gathering at the Bharat Tex 2025 at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi today, Mr. Modi said the vision of Farm, Fibre, Fabric, Fashion and Foreign has become a mission which is expanding areas of growth of India. He said India is the sixth largest textile and apparel exporter today. Mr. Modi said India's exports in the textiles sector is currently three lakh crore rupees and the target is to reach nine lakh crore rupees by 2030.

The Prime Minister also visited the exhibition area and interacted with the exhibitors. Bharat Tex 2025, a major global event, is being held from February 14th to 17th. The event brings together the entire textile value chain, from raw materials to finished products, including accessories, under one roof.



The second edition of the much-anticipated musical event, Fusion of the Bands, was held at the Rangapahar Military Station last evening. Addressing the occasion as Chief Guest, Governor of Nagaland, La Ganesan highlighted India's rich diversity and the unifying power of music. He emphasized that the fusion of Naga artists' musical passion with the universal appeal of Hindi music is a testament to India's unity in diversity. The Governor underscored that Hindi is more than just a medium of communication, but serves as a bridge that connects hearts and minds, playing a crucial role in fostering national integration. He asserted that embracing Hindi alongside local dialects strengthens India's unity without overshadowing regional cultures. Acknowledging the North East's exceptional musical talent, the Governor expressed confidence that musicians from the region could outshine their counterparts from other parts of the country. Meanwhile, the Yellow Casettes band from Mokochung was crowned the winner of Fusion of the Bands Season-2. Back Pocket from Dimapur and Cross Fade Band from Dimapur secured the first and second runner-up positions respectively.



Railways have started a high-level inquiry into the incident of stampede at the New Delhi railway station last night, in which 18 passengers reportedly have lost their lives. The Ministry of Railways named Principal Chief Commercial Manager Narsingh Deo and Principal Chief Security Commissioner Pankaj Gangwar as part of the inquiry committee. Chief Public Relations Officer of Northern Railway, Himanshu Shekhar Upadhyay said, a two-member high level inquiry committee has been constituted to probe the stampede incident.

Meanwhile, Delhi Police have also launched an investigation into the incident, saying it will analyze CCTV footage to determine the sequence of events before the chaos erupted. Northern Railways have announced a compensation of 10 lakh rupees to the families of the

deceased, while those who sustained serious injuries will be compensated with 2.5 lakh rupees. Individuals with minor injuries will receive one lakh rupees. The President, the Prime Minister, and the Ministers for Railways, Home and Defence have expressed grief over the incident.



The Angami Students' Union have reiterated its appealed for a noise free environment during the on-going HSLC, HSSLC and CBSE Examinations. The Union stated that an appeal in this regard was issued through a press release on 8th February. However, several complaints have been received about non compliance from cafes, restaurants and certain pockets around Kohima town, indulging in playing loud music during unusual hours. In view of the complaints, the Union have submitted a formal complaint to the Deputy Commissioner of Kohima today acknowledging the competency of the district administration in ensuring a conducive environment for the students to prepare and appear for their examinations. The Union further asked the respective colony panchayats, council and youth organizations to ensure that such unwelcoming activities are not tolerated.
