POLLS:

The Bharatiya Janata Party has registered victory in the Delhi Assembly Election, returning to power after 27 years by defeating the incumbent Aam Aadmi Party. The BJP won 48 seats in the 70-member legislative assembly, while the AAP bagged 22 seats. The notable faces who lost include senior AAP leaders Arvind Kejriwal and Manish Sisodia. The third contender, Congress has been completely wiped out after failing to win even a single seat.

NAGALAND:
