REGIONAL ENGLISH NEWS BULLETIN

The Ministry of Home Affairs announced the extension of the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA) for another six months in parts of Manipur, Arunachal Pradesh, and Nagaland, starting tomorrow. In Arunachal Pradesh, AFSPA applies to Tirap, Changlang, Longding districts, and certain areas in Namsai district. In Manipur, AFSPA will continue in all districts except for those under the jurisdiction of 13 police stations in five districts – Imphal West, Imphal East, Thoubal, Bishnupur, and Kakching. The state has been grappling with ethnic violence since May 2023. The law has also been extended in eight districts of Nagaland and parts of five others.

Governor Lt. General KT Parnaik (Retd.) held the maiden episode of the cultural presentation, titled 'Arunachal Pradesh Sanskriti, Parampara aur Kala Tayohar' at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar yesterday. The tayohar has been conceptualized by the Governor to celebrate the State's rich cultural heritage. Speaking on the occasion, the Governor reaffirmed Raj Bhavan's commitment to promoting local artists and cultural groups through initiatives under the 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' program. Troupes, representing various tribes, including Monpa, Adi, Puroik, Wancho, and Nyishi, participated in the event, showcasing the vibrant traditions of Arunachal Pradesh.

Held between March 26-28, the workshop aims to equip participants with the skills to identify and document the regional biodiversity, understand potential ecotourism models and develop strategies to promote sustainable tourism and link it to the local economy. 30 participants from Shergaon and neighbouring villages including Chug, Morshing, Tenzing, Jigaon and Thonglei took part in the workshop.
