The Budget session of the Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly began today. This is the fourth session of the Eighth Legislative Assembly. The five-day assembly session will conclude on March 12. The proceeding on the first day commenced with Governor Lt Gen (retd) KT Parnaik's address to the house. The Governor on the occasion said that the Budget for the Financial Year 2025-26 will not only lay out the strategic direction for the State's development over the next year, but will also serve as a blueprint and action plan for achieving the goal of building a Viksit Arunachal 2047. He said, through strategic allocations, the government aims to address the state's multifaceted needs, fostering inclusive growth and sustainable development. The Governor added that by prioritizing the critical sectors, government will be setting the stage for a transformative era in Arunachal Pradesh, ensuring development benefits reach all corners of our society. Four bills were introduced in the House today, including The Arunachal Pradesh Arun Parivar Patra Authority Bill, 2025. This bill aims to establish a family-centric citizen database for the state. The objective is to enhance governance by ensuring efficient, transparent, and targeted delivery of public welfare benefits and services.

Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein stated that the government has enacted various laws to curb rampant gambling and the illegal collection of donations in the state. He informed the House that all district administrations have been directed to strictly enforce these laws. He made this statement while responding to a private member's resolution moved by MLA Kumar Waii, who urged the government to take necessary measures to stop the unauthorized sale of lottery tickets, Housie tickets, and illegal collection of donations. The Deputy Chief Minister emphasized that law enforcement alone is not enough to address the issue of gambling. He stressed the need for greater public responsibility, increased awareness, and civic sense to effectively tackle these social concerns.

The monthly district-level Narcotic Coordination Committee meeting of Tawang district was held at the DCs office this afternoon.
