The Health Minister also reminded medical officers that no transformation occurs without human effort and emphasized the need to improve not only the outward appearance of district hospitals but also their clinical performance. Mr. Konyak also expressed his desire to visit all health units across the districts.



Zunheboto District Hospital has received the Kayakalp Award for 2024-2025 as the best government district hospital in Nagaland, while Dr. Imkongliba Memorial District Hospital received the Kayakalp Award for 2023-2024. District Hospital Mon and CHC Changtongnya were awarded the Eco-Friendly Award for the year 2024-2025, while Kiphire District Hospital received the Eco-Friendly Award for 2023-2024. Under the Kayakalp Award 2024-2025, Bhandari in Wokha was awarded the best CHC, Kuhuboto PHC in Dimapur won the best PHC category, and Longmisa in Mokokchung received the award for the best Health & Wellness Centre (HWC). The awards -- which carry cash prizes and certificates -- were presented today during a felicitation programme held at the Directorate of Health and Family Welfare in Kohima. Meanwhile, three more health units—Kuhuboto PHC, CHO Rusomo HWC-Sub Centre Kohima, and Singrep HWC Kiphire, have received the national certification of public health facilities based on National Quality Assurance Standards (NQAS). Altogether, there are now nine NQAS-certified health units in the state.



Advisor for School Education & SCERT, Dr. Kekhrielhoulie Yhome, has emphasized ongoing initiatives to strengthen the sports ecosystem in Nagaland. The championship is scheduled to take place on March 28 at Khuochiezhie Local Ground, Kohima, NWA President Vivolie Kezo announced at a media briefing today. Mr Kezo said, a total of 129 wrestlers, including 100 men and 29 women, will participate in the open championship. The participating tribes are Angami, Chakhesang, Zeliang, Lotha, Sumi, Pochury, Rengma, Chang, Ao, and Phom. The NWA president also highlighted on the format for the upcoming championship.

Mr. Kezo appealed for the support and cooperation of all Naga communities to promote this traditional sport. Meanwhile, NWA General Secretary Kenlum Hemang announced the association's decision to hold two categories of wrestling, that is, Naga Traditional Wrestling and Naga Wrestling.

The 15th edition will feature three categories in the men's division- above 90 kg, below 90 kg, and 75 kg. In the women's open, two categories will be introduced-60 kg and above, and below 60 kg.
