MLA, Achumbemo Kikon has flagged concerns over the proposed One Nation One Election (ONOE) saying it would defeat the federal structure laid down by the Indian Constitution. He stressed that a one-size-fits-all approach would harm the democratic features of the country. In a statement on the final day in Assembly yesterday, the MLA emphasized that simultaneous elections of Lok Sabha and state assembly would marginalize relevance of regional parties and concerns, as central campaigns may sideline issues specific to Nagaland.

Mr Kikon also critiqued the notion that ONOE would reduce election expenditures. While cost-cutting measures are necessary, he argued that these should not come at the expense of federalism, and called for stronger regulatory mechanisms to manage election spending. Highlighting the country's large population and complex electoral system, the MLA said while ONOE might be feasible in the future, it remains an unrealistic solution for India for now.



Nagaland Legislative Assembly, NLA, Speaker, Sharingain Longkumer, has praised the 2025 state budget, calling it one of the most holistic ever presented. He emphasized that the budget signifies a "resurgent Nagaland" and will drive significant transformation despite ongoing challenges.
