Speaking on the occasion, she said several educational institutions in the country have the potential to achieve global brand value. She stressed the need for further promotion of research in the country. The President also urged the leaders of higher education institutions to take new steps in the field of Artificial Intelligence.

He also emphasized the use of AI, machine learning, and geospatial conflict management, for forest fire and wildlife collaborating with BISAG-N and the Forest Survey of India. Uttar Pradesh recorded the highest numbers, followed by Bihar, West Bengal, and Assam.
