In an effort towards studying the causes of gastric cancer and its prevention, the Minister of Health Biyuram Wahge has launched a Gastric Cancer Epidemiology and Risk Study at Gyati Takka General Hospital, Ziro yesterday. On the occasion, the Minister also launched the four-day gastric cancer screening programme. The gastric cancer screening programme is being organised by Dr. B. Borooah Cancer Institute, Guwahati in association with the State Cancer Society of Arunachal Pradesh, Naharlagun and Gyati Takka General Hospital, Ziro. The initiative is supported by the District Administration, Lower Subansiri District and Community Advisory Board. Later in the day, the Health Minister launched a campaign 'Action Against Stigma', an initiative of the TB Association of India.
