Security has been beefed up across Mizoram ahead of Union Home Minister Amit Shah's scheduled visit to the northeastern state. Mr Shah will pay a day-long visit to Mizoram today to attend a function for the shifting of Assam Rifles establishments from the heart of Aizawl to a designated complex at Zokhawsang, 15 km from the state capital. We have a report from Aizawl correspondent.

VISIT BYTE: The visit of Union Home Minister Amit Shah will hold great significance and historical importance as it would fulfill the long cherished dreams of the Mizo people in relocating Assam Rifles from Aizawl city to Zokhawsang, which is about 15kms from the state capital Aizawl. The Mizo people have been demanding shifting of Assam Rifles bases to a new location since 1988. The then MNF Government under Laldenga first put the demand for relocation of Assam Rifles from the heart of Aizawl city. In October last year, a Memorandum of Agreement was signed between the Lalduhoma-led ZPM Government and Assam Rifles which will come effective from April this year. With the relocation function of Assam Rifles to be held in the presence of Home Minister Amit Shah, a new landmark chapter of history will be written in Mizoram after 3 decades." Union Minister of State for Science and Technology, Jitendra Singh yesterday said that Northeast is a key driver for India to realise the vision of Viksit Bharat and the region will also become the country's next saffron hub. While laying the foundation stone for the new permanent campus of the North East Centre for Technology Application and Reach (NECTAR) in Shillong, Dr. Singh stated that since 2021, the government's Mission Saffron has expanded saffron cultivation across Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, and Meghalaya.

Dr. Singh said that large-scale cultivation is now underway at Menchukha of Arunachal Pradesh and Yuksom of Sikkim, with plans to extend to Nagaland and Manipur. It will turn the Northeast region as India's next saffron hub after Jammu and Kashmir's Pampore.

India has termed the allegations made by Pakistan that India was involved in its train hijacking as baseless. In response to media queries on the remarks made by the Pakistan side, External Affairs Ministry's spokesperson, Randhir Jaiswal said that New Delhi strongly rejects the baseless allegations of Pakistan. He added that the whole world knows where the epicenter of global terrorism lies. Mr. Jaiswal said that Pakistan should look inwards instead of pointing fingers and shifting the blame for its own internal problems and failures on to others.



The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has generated nearly 143 million US dollars in foreign exchange revenue through satellite launches. The Department of Space said that ISRO launched a total of 393 foreign satellites and 3 Indian customer satellites on a commercial basis over the past decade. ISRO's

impressive track record includes launching satellites for 34 countries, including the United States, the United Kingdom, Singapore, and several other developed nations.



The State Department of Finance has declared all Saturdays of this month as transaction days for Government Bills. 15th, 22nd, and 29th of March, which are typically non-transaction days, will now be transaction days for both the state treasuries and banks in the state of Nagaland. This declaration was made in consideration of the financial year-end.



In a move to safeguard local wildlife, Nungying Village Council has prohibited all forms of hunting and fishing within the village jurisdiction. This decision, taken during a recent council meeting, enforces Resolution 2, which aims to protect the natural environment. The ban, effective from March 10, this year forbids the use of any armaments or chemicals for hunting or fishing. Individuals or groups found violating the directive will face a fine of 5,000 rupees per person. The restriction will remain until further village in place notice from the council.
