Union Home Minister Amit Shah has said, Narendra Modi government has strengthened the security of the nation through political will and the use of technology in the past ten years. Replying to a discussion on the working of the Home Ministry in Rajya Sabha yesterday,he highlighted that the NDA government has zero tolerance policy towards terrorism.

Mr. Shah pointed out that there has been a 70 percent reduction in deaths due to terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir during the NDA government and terror incidents have also fallen sharply. He pointed out that the country faced three major challenges in the past which hindered its progress and development - terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir, Left Wing Extremism and insurgency in North East. He stated that the government has dealt with all these challenges with a firm hand. The Home Minister emphasized that naxalism in India will be eliminated by March next year.

Dimapur Congress Committee (DCC) has demanded setting up of a special investigation committee to conduct forensic audit of financial transactions and work progress of the recent renovation and modernisation of Dimapur Town Hall. This was stated by President, DCC, Kutoho Chishi in a press conference yesterday. The President said, an RTI was filed on the construction of the Dimapur Town hall which amounted to over 19.90 crore rupees. Mr Chishi said, the special investigation committee should include the DCC officials for the satisfaction of the people of the state. The committee should investigate procurement process for potential overpricing, so as to ensure that all documentation are complete and legible and to enforce penalty clauses for delays and non-compliance with specifications.

Naga People's Front (NPF) President Apong Pongener urged party workers to intensify efforts to strengthen the party at the grassroots level. The Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services (AH&VS), Nagaland, yesterday kicked off Phase V of its Foot-and-Mouth Disease (FMD) vaccination programme at Lerie Farm, Kohima.
