The Government today decided to include the caste enumeration in the forthcoming census exercise. The Cabinet Committee on Political Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has taken a decision in this regard. Briefing media in New Delhi about the decision, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw highlighted that it will strengthen the social and economic structure of the society while the nation continues to progress. The Minister informed that the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) has approved a new highway from Shillong to Silchar with the cost of 22 thousand 864 crore rupees. Mr Vaishnaw said the project will prove instrumental in the development of the North Eastern region. The CCEA also approved fair and remunerative price of sugarcane for sugar season 2025-26 at 355 rupees per quintal for the farmers.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate India's first-of-its-kind World Audio Visual Entertainment Summit (WAVES) 2025 at Jio World Convention Centre in Mumbai tomorrow. The four-day summit with tagline Connecting Creators, Connecting Countries is poised to position India as a global hub for media, entertainment, and digital innovation. During the summit, India will host the Global Media Dialogue for the first time, with ministerial participation from 25 countries, marking a milestone in the country's engagement with the global media and entertainment landscape.

Governor Lt. General KT Parnaik (Retd.) participated in a powerpoint presentation on the application of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar today. The Governor emphasized that automation is imperative for good governance, stating that adopting AI tools can significantly enhance efficiency in record-keeping, data analysis, and real-time planning. He underscored that Arunachal Pradesh can also move towards becoming Viksit Arunachal by building a strong foundation based on AI integration. State Ministers, Gabriel D.
