REGIONAL ENGLISH NEWS BULLETIN

Union Home Minister Amit Shah today chaired a high-level meeting regarding the Indus Water Treaty of 1960 with Pakistan at his residence in New Delhi. India has suspended the Indus Waters Treaty in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack. External Affairs Minister Dr S Jaishankar, Union Jal Shakti Minister C.R. Paatil and senior government officials attended the meeting. Earlier, Home Minister Shah spoke to all Chief Ministers, asking them to identify all Pakistani nationals in their states. Sources said Mr. Shah asked the Chief Ministers to take steps to ensure their prompt return to Pakistan.

The Ministry of Civil Aviation today informed that 183 passengers through two special flights have safely returned to their homes yesterday. In a statement, the Ministry of Civil Aviation said that two free-of-cost flights were arranged for passengers from Srinagar to Mumbai. The Ministry said that a third flight is currently underway carrying more than 232 citizens, which will reach Mumbai this evening.

The Panchayati Raj leaders from the State including ZPCs, GPCs, and GPMs along with officers and State Institute of Rural Development faculty have successfully completed a 5-day training programme on Rural Governance and Cooperation at Tribhuvan Sahakari, Gujarat. While sharing the information in a social media post, Chief Minister Pema Khandu emphasized that the enriching course will further strengthen their understanding of rural governance, cooperative models, and participatory development. Terming the PR leaders as key pillars for empowering the grassroots institutions, Khandu wished them continued learning and impactful leadership as they return to serve the communities with greater vision and knowledge.

Deputy Director of Health Services-cum-State Programme Officer, Dr. K.T. Mulung has said that 16 out of 27 districts in the State have been declared malaria-free, marking a significant progress in the state's public health achievements. The Deputy Director shared this while addressing the World Malaria Day 2025 event at Naharlagun today. Dr. Mulung commended the tireless efforts of health workers,

community volunteers, and field staff that have made this possible. He reiterated the Department's commitment to achieving a malaria-free Arunachal Pradesh by 2027. Additionally, the East Kameng District Administration organized a bike rally at Seppa today to create awareness regarding Malaria. The DA in a social media post informed that zero cases of malaria patients have been reported in the last 3 years in the district.
