Prime Minister Narendra Modi today stressed that the perpetrators and conspirators of the Pahalgam terror attack will be given a befitting reply. Addressing the nation in his Mann Ki Baat programme on Akashvani, Mr Modi expressed anguish at the terror incident in Pahalgam which occurred on the 22nd of this month. PM Modi said that condolences are continuously pouring in from all over the world following the terror attack. He said global leaders have called him up and written letters strongly condemning this heinous terrorist attack.

The National Investigation Agency has begun the process of formally taking over the Pahalgam terror attack case following orders from the Home Ministry. NIA teams, which have been camping at the terror attack site since Wednesday, have intensified the search for evidence. The NIA said in a statement that the teams, overseen by an IG, a DIG and an SP from the anti-terror agency, are examining the eyewitnesses who had seen the attack unfold at the Baisaran valley. The entry and exit points are being closely scrutinized by the NIA teams for clues to the modus operandi of the terrorists.

India will unveil the Bharat Pavilion at the WAVES 2025 scheduled from May 1-4 in Mumbai. Sharing the information in a social media post today, Chief Minister Pema Khandu said that this major milestone unlocks a world of opportunities. Khandu additionally, informed that these institutes will now be offering UGC-recognized degrees (Master's and Under Graduate Courses), Credit transfer & exchange with national & global universities, Students eligible for higher

education, academic posts, loans & subsidies. UG programs based on NEP 2020 will begin from Jote campus, Khandu added.

A joint team of scientists and engineers undertook detailed glacio-hydrological studies at the Khangri Glacier in the Gori-chen mountain range from April 19 to 26. The Centre for Earth Sciences and Himalayan Studies, Government of Arunachal Pradesh along with the National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research, Goa, Ministry of Earth Sciences and the Indian Institute of Technology, Guwahati conducted the studies as part of the 3rd high-altitude expedition to the Khangri Glacier in the Gori-chen Mountain region. The joint team—comprising four scientists and engineers each from NCPOR and CESHS, and one expert from IIT Guwahati—undertook detailed glacio-hydrological studies aimed at understanding the glacier's health and associated water resources.

The India Meteorological Department has issued a Yellow alert over 18 districts in the state. IMD has forecast rainfall with thunderstorms with lightning very likely to occur at isolated locations over the next 24 hours. Additionally, an increase in the rainfall activity has been predicted for tomorrow.
