India and Thailand today signed six agreements for cooperation in various fields including IT, maritime, MSME, handicrafts and handloom sectors. The agreements were exchanged following bilateral talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Thai counterpart Paetongtarn Shinawatra at Bangkok this afternoon. Both sides reviewed the progress of the entire gamut of bilateral relations and discussed ways to add greater momentum to the India-Thailand bilateral partnership and exchanged views on regional and multilateral issues.

The Rajya Sabha has taken up the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025 for consideration and passing. The Waqf (Amendment) Bill 2025 aims to streamline the management of Waqf properties with provisions to safeguard heritage sites and promote social welfare. The legislation also aims to improve governance by streamlining coordination between Waqf Boards and local authorities and protecting stakeholder's rights. The Bill also seeks to improve the economic and social status of Muslim women, particularly widows and divorced women. Moving the bill, Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said the bill has been brought after a detailed consultation with the stakeholders as well as in the Joint Parliamentary Committee. He urged the opposition parties to support this bill. Yesterday, the Lok Sabha has passed the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025.

The second edition of the Arunachal Youth Parliament 2.0 commenced at the D.K. Hall, Arunachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly in Itanagar today. The two day event began with an engaging debate titled 'Dams in Arunachal Pradesh: Catalyst for Development or Threat to Sustainability?' between Dera Natung Government College and Don Bosco College. Addressing the gathering Patron, AYP Abu Tayeng said that the parliament is designed to empower state's young minds by giving them a stage to debate, discuss and dream up solutions for their state's future. The event will continue till tomorrow.

Two persons were attacked with a local machete at Banderdewa market under Arunachal Pradesh last evening after a tiff over free fish demand. The fish vendor, Arun Hazarika sustained grievous injuries and is admitted to TRIHMS in Naharlagun. According to SP ICR Naharlagun Mihin Gambo, a 56 year old alleged accused was arrested by the Banderdewa police team.
