A day after India revoked visas issued to Pakistani nationals in the wake of Pahalgam terror attack, Union Home Minister Amit Shah yesterday spoke to all Chief Ministers asking them to identify all Pakistan nationals in their states. Mr. Shah asked the Chief Ministers to take steps to ensure their prompt return to Pakistan. Meanwhile, Union Home Secretary Govind Mohan has held a meeting with Chief Secretaries of all the States and Union Territories through video conferencing over the issue and urged them to ensure strict compliance of the order related to suspension of visa service to Pakistani nationals. India has revoked all existing Visas issued to Pakistanis, except Long Term Visas, Diplomatic and Official visas with effect from Sunday.



Pope Francis, the head of the worldwide Roman Catholic Church, will be laid to rest at the Basilica of Saint Mary Major in Rome today. The funeral Mass will begin at 1:30 PM Indian Standard Time in Saint Peter's Square in Vatican city. The service will be led by Cardinal Giovanni Battista Re, dean of the College of Cardinals. Tens of thousands of mourners, including heads of state and representatives from across the world are expected to attend the funeral mass of late pontiff. These include, President Droupadi Murmu, who will offer condolences on behalf of the government and people of India. US. President Donald Trump, France President Emmanuel Macron, Brazil President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva and Argentine President Javier Milei are among the other world leaders who will be attending the funeral. President Murmu reached Rome in Italy yesterday and paid homage to the Pope Francis by laying a wreath at Basilica of Saint Peter in Vatican City. The funeral ceremony will conclude with transfer of coffin to Saint Mary Major in Rome, where the burial will take place. Pope Francis, the first Latin American pope to lead the Roman Catholic Church, and sovereign of the Vatican City State passed away on 21st of April at the age of 88.



Diocese of Kohima organized Requiem Eucharistic Celebrations in memory of late Pope Francis at different parishes of the diocese. The first Mass was celebrated on Thursday at Holy Cross Church, Dimapur, followed by the second held yesterday at Mary Help of Christians Cathedral, Kohima.

The final Mass will be held at St. Joseph Church, Chümoukedima today. During the Eucharistic Celebration at the Cathedral, Bishop James Thoppil paid tribute to late Pontiff, who passed away on Monday in the 12th year of his papacy. In his homily, the Bishop expressed how the entire world is mourning the loss of a beloved spiritual leader. He said that Pope Francis was special for his charismatic personality, his simplicity, sense of closeness to people, and the fresh, often unconventional vocabulary he brought into papal discourse. Highlighting Pope Francis' contributions, Bishop Thoppil remarked on the series of historic 'firsts' associated with his papacy where he was the first Jesuit pope, the first Latin American pope, and the first non-European pope in over a millennium.



India is observing state mourning today, as a mark of respect on the funeral of the Supreme pontiff being held today. Home Ministry said that the National Flag will be flown at Half Mast throughout India on all buildings where the National Flag is flown regularly. The Government had announced a three-day state mourning on the passing away of Pope Francis. Two days' state mourning was observed on 22nd and 23rd of this month.



Minister for Environment, Forest & Climate Change and Village Guards, CL John, on Thursday inaugurated the Forest Beat Office at Khezhakeno, under Phek District.
