Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Law & Justice and Parliamentary Affairs, Arjun Ram Meghwal, underscored the nation's commitment to "Excess Justice for All," highlighting the evolving dynamics of equality and justice in contemporary India. The Union Minister made the remarks while addressing the valedictory programme of the State Level Mega Legal Services Camp held in Kohima yesterday. Speaking at the valedictory programme of the State Mega Legal Services Camp held in

Kohima yesterday, Mr. Rio highlighted that the judiciary has remained one of the strongest pillars of nation-building since India's independence, and urged that its efforts must be acknowledged and appreciated by all.

He appreciated the State Legal Services Authority, in collaboration with the State Government, for organizing the biggest legal awareness camp in the state. Mr expressed hope that the camp would greatly benefit the marginalized and downtrodden ensuring that justice and legal assistance are accessible to all.
