Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that India is set to become the third largest economy in the world very soon. Addressing an event organised by a private media house, Mr Modi said that this unprecedented growth is being driven by the youth. The Prime Minister added that India has sprinted ahead at doubled speed and doubled the size of its economy in just one decade.

The Waqf (Amendment) Act 2025 has come into effect yesterday. The government has issued a notification to this effect following the assent given by President Droupadi Murmu to the legislation. Last week, both Houses of Parliament passed the legislation. The new law aims to streamline the management of Waqf properties, with provisions to safeguard heritage sites and promote social welfare. It also aims to improve governance by enhancing transparency in property management, streamlining coordination between Waqf Boards and local authorities, and protecting stakeholders' rights.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has emphasised the importance of focusing on art, music, culture, and creativity—elements that distinguish humans from machines, adding that the world is rapidly advancing in technology and AI. The Prime Minister was addressing an event organized by a private media house in New Delhi last night. The Department of Financial Services in the Finance Ministry has notified amalgamation of 26 Regional Rural Banks, (RRBs) on the principles of "One State One RRB". This is the fourth phase of amalgamation of RRBs. The Ministry rolled out an amalgamation plan in November last year, building on improvements in efficiency from previous phases. Post-amalgamation, there will be 28 RRBs covering 700 districts with more than 22,000 branches.

The meeting focused on logistics, transport, security, traffic, and the involvement of various departments in setting up exhibition stalls.
