Indian Armed Forces targeted Air Defence Radars and systems at a number of locations in Pakistan this morning. According to the Defence Ministry, it has been learnt that an Air Defence system at Lahore has been neutralised. The Ministry said, India's response has been in the same domain with the same intensity as Pakistan. Briefing media this evening, Wing Commander Vyomika Singh said Pakistan attempted to target several locations in India last night.

The Ministry said, Pakistan has increased the intensity of its unprovoked firing across the Line of Control using mortars and heavy calibre artillery in various areas in Jammu and Kashmir. The Ministry said, 16 innocent lives have been lost, including three women and five children, due to Pakistani firing. In retaliation, India was compelled to respond to bring mortar and artillery fire from Pakistan to a halt. Indian Armed Forces have reiterated their commitment to non-escalation, provided it is respected by the Pakistani military.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi today chaired a high-level meeting with Secretaries of various Ministries and Departments to review national preparedness and inter-ministerial coordination in light of recent developments concerning national security. During the meeting, Mr Modi stressed the need for seamless coordination among Ministries and agencies to uphold operational continuity and institutional resilience. Key issues discussed during the meeting included strengthening civil defence mechanisms, combating misinformation and fake news, and ensuring security of critical infrastructure. Ministries were

advised to maintain close coordination with states and ground-level institutions. The Prime Minister directed secretaries to conduct a comprehensive review of their ministry's operations, focused on emergency response, and communication protocols. The meeting was attended by the Cabinet Secretary, senior officials from the PMO, and Secretaries from key ministries including Defence, Home Affairs, External Affairs, Information and Broadcasting, and others.



Leaders of all political parties today hailed the valour of the Indian Armed Forces for their retaliatory action against terrorism and extended their support in one voice during an all-party meeting on Operation Sindoor. The meeting, chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh at Parliament House in New Delhi, was attended by Leaders from over a dozen parties. Mr Singh briefed them about the operation. Briefing media after the meeting, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju termed the meeting as constructive and each leader expressed their views with responsibility and maturity, recognising the major challenge the country is currently facing.

Mr Rijiju informed that the operation Sindoor is still on.

Also known as Red Crescent Day, the day commemorates the birth anniversary of the founder of the Red Cross and the International Committee of the Red Cross, Henry Dunant. The theme for this year 'Keeping Humanity Alive'.



Nagaland Governor and President of the Indian Red Cross Society, Nagaland State Branch La Ganesan today called for collective compassion and greater youth participation in humanitarian service. Central Government has asked OTT and media streaming platforms as well as intermediaries operating in India to discontinue streaming media contents having its origins in Pakistan with immediate effect. The Information and Broadcasting Ministry today issued an advisory to them citing the interest of national security in view of Pahalgam terror attack. The Ministry advised them to stop streaming of Pakistani web-series, films, songs, podcasts and other media content, whether made available on a subscription-based model or otherwise.
