Lok Sabha MP, S. Supongmeren Jamir has emphasized the importance of unity, humility, and accountability among Naga leaders to foster meaningful change in the state. He also called on tribal Hohos and civil society organizations to actively engage with and ensure that elected representatives voice their aspirations. Mr Jamir was speaking during a Community Ambulance Distribution Programme under the Members of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme 2024–2025, in Dimapur today. He also appealed for collective efforts to safeguard Naga identity, culture, and rights amid external pressures.

Gracing the event as special guest, Deputy Commissioner of Dimapur, Dr. Tinojongshi Chang, lauded the MP's initiative and stressed the need to cooperation among the people to achieve development goals. During the event, four ambulances were handed over to Ao Senden Mokokchung; Chakhroma Public Organisation; Eastern Nagaland People's Union Dimapur; and Western Sumi Hoho.



The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship yesterday launched a pilot programme to promote apprenticeship training in the northeastern region. Under the scheme, over 26,000 youths from the region will receive an additional 1,500 rupees per month for one year, over and above the regular stipend provided through the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme. Launching the scheme in Aizawl, Union Minister of State for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Jayant Chaudhary, said the initiative will open

doors of real industry exposure for the region's youths, allowing them to understand the dynamics of contemporary industry, and align their skills with real-world demand. He emphasized that North East should not remain at the periphery of India's skilling efforts, but become a driving force.

The Minister also highlighted that North East leads India in women's participation in skilling, showcasing its progressive cultural ethos. A total of 43.94 crore rupees has been earmarked for the pilot initiative.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that tomorrow is a landmark day for India's railway infrastructure. In a social media post, he said, the Amrit Stations will boost comfort, connectivity and celebrate the country's glorious culture. The Prime Minister will inaugurate 103 Amrit Bharat Stations with modern amenities, from Bikaner, Rajasthan tomorrow. These stations have been upgraded and redeveloped under the Amrit Bharat Station Scheme as city centres, showcasing regional culture and heritage.



In a major push for climate resilience and women empowerment, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs has launched the 'Women for Trees' campaign under the AMRUT Mitra initiative. The nationwide campaign is a women-led plantation drive aimed at increasing urban greenery in heat-stressed areas. The initiative will roll out in two phases. In the first phase, from today till May 23, over 50,000 women from Self Help Groups will visit plantation sites such as water bodies, parks and government lands. In Nagaland, site visits are scheduled at Mokokchung today, in Phek tomorrow, and at Dimapur, Kiphire, Kohima, Longleng, Peren, Tuensang, Wokha and Zunheboto on May 23. The second phase will begin on World Environment Day, June 5, during which active plantation of trees will be carried out.



An all-party delegation led by JD(U) MP Sanjay Kumar Jha today left for a five-nation visit as part of India's diplomatic outreach on Operation Sindoor and to further expose Pakistan-sponsored terrorism. The delegation will visit Indonesia, Malaysia, the Republic of Korea, Japan and Singapore to project the country's resolute approach to combat terrorism in all its forms. Talking to the media before the departure of the delegation in New Delhi, Mr. Jha said terrorism is a part of Pakistan's state policy, and they will tell the world how Islamabad has been sponsoring terrorism.
