The Chakhesang Students' Union (CSU) has called for an indefinite blockade on the movement of all government-registered vehicles, including those belonging to National Highways & Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited (NHIDCL) and Ratna Infrastructure Projects Private Limited, along NH-29 stretch between Chakhabama-Kikruma. The Union stated that it had given a reasonable timeframe of over six months, to NHIDCL and Ratna Limited to meet the demands and complete the project. However, both parties failed to fulfil their commitments, leading to prolonged inconvenience for commuters and the general public. The Union in inform that the blockade will begin at 6:00 AM today and will remain in place indefinitely. It has directed all stakeholders to comply with the directive and added that NHIDCL would be solely responsible for any incidents arising from the situation.

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Director General of Military Operations, DGMO of the Indian Army, Lieutenant General Rajiv Ghai yesterday said strikes across nine terror hubs in Pakistan and PoJK under Operation Sindoor killed over 100 terrorists. Briefing media in New Delhi last evening, the DGMO said they include strategic targets such as Yusuf Azhar, Abdul Malik Rauf and Mudasir Ahmed that were involved in the hijack of IC814 and the Pulwama blast.
