Prime Minister Narendra Modi today gave a strong message to Islamabad, saying that there is no place left in Pakistan where terrorists can breathe in peace. He said, India has the capability to eliminate terrorists at their homes. Modi said this while interacting with the air warriors and soldiers at Air Force Station Adampur in Punjab. Hailing the success of Operation Sindoor, the Prime Minister said, India has destroyed nine terrorist camps and eliminated over 100 terrorists in Pakistan. He said, the Pakistani army, on which these terrorists were relying, has been defeated by the Indian Armed Forces. He said, the masters of terror have now realized that shedding the blood of innocent people will have only one outcome - devastation and utter annihilation. The Prime Minister lauded the courage, valor and professionalism of the armed forces in protecting the nation during Operation Sindoor. He said, Operation Sindoor has boosted the nation's morale, united the country in a thread of unity, and protected India's borders.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has outlined India's unwavering commitment to combat terrorism, following the success of Operation Sindoor. Addressing the nation yesterday evening, Modi said that the world has seen India's capabilities, and it is clear terrorists will no longer be spared. He said, Operation Sindoor has sent an unambiguous message to terrorist groups and their supporters that any attack on India and its citizens will be met with full force. Modi said that India will not engage in any discussions with Pakistan except those concerning terrorism and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK).

The External Affairs Ministry said that India is having its long standing national position on any issues related to the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, adding that these issues will have to be addressed by India and Pakistan bilaterally. Replying to a question during media briefing in New Delhi, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said India's policy over this matter has not changed and any outstanding matter is the vacation of illegally occupied Indian territory by Pakistan.

In a historic move, Chief Minister Pema Khandu today chaired the State Cabinet meeting at Kibithu, the last border outpost in Anjaw district, under the 'Cabinet Aapke Dwar' initiative. The

Cabinet approved the formation of a joint venture company with NEEPCO to implement five hydropower projects in Shi-Yomi district – Tato I, Heo, Tato II, Naying, and Hirong. Of these, Tato I and Heo have already secured Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) clearance and are poised to begin construction. Cabinet also restored the 144 MW Gongri HEP to M/s Dirang Energy Private Limited under a new hydropower policy. Major reforms in the education sector were also cleared, including a revised transfer policy for teachers and creation of 32 new posts at Arunachal Pradesh University. To strengthen security, 200 Home Guard posts were sanctioned. The Cabinet also approved administrative restructuring, Mission Karmayogi implementation, and the launch of the Sunrise Festival in Anjaw.

An eleven-day nationwide outreach campaign on 'Operation Sindoor' has been launched today. Largely known as Tiranga Yatra, the campaign aims to highlight Indian Armed Force's success against Pakistan. Ex-servicemen, social workers, social organisations as well as prominent BJP leaders will be part of this public programme. Meanwhile, Arunachal Pradesh leaders led by Chief Minister Pema Khandu participated in a Tiranga Yatra at Walong in Anjaw district ahead of the Cabinet meeting today. The Yatra culminated at the Walong War Memorial, where the leaders paid homage to the valiant jawans who made the supreme sacrifice during the 1962 war. Apart from the ministers, Army personnel, and the local community participated in it.

Central Board of Secondary Education has declared the results of Class 12th and 10th examinations. In Class 12, 88.39 percent of students have passed, marking an increase of 0.41 percentage points over last year. Girls have outperformed boys by 5.94 percentage points, with over 91 percent passing the exam. 83.62 percent pass percentage was recorded in Guwahati Region, while Arunachal Pradesh's overall pass percentage is 79.02 percent. In Arunachal too, girls outperformed boys, recording an encouraging 81.55 percent pass percentage against boys' 76.30 percent. In Class 10, 93.66 percent of students have cleared the board exam - an increase of 0.06 percentage points from last year. Girls have again outshone boys by 2.37 percentage points, with 95 percent of them passing.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated students who have successfully cleared the CBSE Class 12th and 10th examinations. In a social media post, he highlighted that the results are a reflection

of the students' determination, discipline, and hard work. Addressing those who may be disappointed with their scores, the Prime Minister conveyed that a single exam does not define an individual. He reassured students that their journey is much greater and their potential extends far beyond any marksheet. He encouraged them to remain confident and curious, reminding them that great things lie ahead.
