Prime Minister Narendra Modi has hailed the Indian Armed Forces for Operation Sindoor's success and said that their valour brought Pakistan to its knees. Prime Minister Modi said Pakistan will have to pay a price for every terrorist attack in India. Modi was addressing the function after laying the foundation stone and inaugurating various development projects worth over 26000 crore rupees in Palana near Bikaner in Rajasthan today. Pm said that Pakistan has been continuously spreading terrorism since independence, but now the price of such incidents will have to be borne by Pakistan's army and its economy.

Highlighting the initiatives taken to create robust infrastructure in the country in the last 11 years, PM said, several big initiatives have been taken to create modern road and rail infrastructure.

External Affairs Minister Dr S Jaishankar today asserted that cessation of firing and military action during Operation Sindoor was negotiated directly between India and Pakistan. In an interview with a Netherlands based broadcaster, Dr Jaishankar said that US Secretary of State Marco Rubio spoke to him while US Vice President JD Vance talked to Prime Minister Narendra Modi highlighting that it is natural that nations call up amid conflict between two nations.

A multi-party delegation headed by JD (U) MP Sanjay Kumar Jha today interacted with leading Japanese think tanks in Tokyo and briefed them on India's zero tolerance against terrorism. The delegation which arrived in Tokyo in the first leg of their five-nation tour, discussed regional security challenges including state-backed terrorism. Meanwhile an Indian all-party delegation arrived in the United Arab Emirates this morning, marking a significant step in New Delhi's diplomatic outreach under Operation Sindoor. The third multi-party delegation led by DMK MP Kanimozhi Karunanidhi has left for a five nation visit to further expose Pakistan-sponsored terrorism.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the two day Rising North East Investors Summit at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi tomorrow. The summit is aimed at highlighting the North East Region as a land of opportunity, attracting global and domestic investment and bringing together key stakeholders, investors and policymakers on a single platform. The main focus sectors of investment promotion include Tourism and Hospitality, Agro-Food Processing, allied sectors and others.

In keeping with its commitment to conducting free, fair, and inclusive elections, the Election Commission of India has launched 18 key initiatives over the last three months to strengthen various aspects of the electoral process. These approaches include voter facilitation, procedural reforms, stakeholder involvement, legal readiness, staff capacity building, and administrative improvements. In the meantime, Chief Electoral Officer, Arunachal Pradesh has urged all individuals, political parties, and stakeholders to actively participate in and endorse these reforms to uphold the essence of democracy.

The Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change today launched a nationwide mass mobilization campaign 'One Nation, One Mission: End Plastic Pollution', in the run up to World Environment Day 2025. This campaign highlights India's unwavering commitment to environmental protection and sustainability, aligned with India's flagship initiative—Mission LiFE.

Education minister PD Sona has written to Union Minister for Education, Dharmendra Pradhan regarding the limited number of CUET examination centres in Arunachal Pradesh. In a letter addressed to the Union Minister, Sona highlighted that CUET is conducted in only four centres in and around Itanagar with limited seating capacity creating logistical hurdles to students from far-flung areas. The education minister has requested the education Ministry to consider setting up at least four additional centres in Pasighat, Bomdila, Tezu, and Aalo to ensure better accessibility and equitable opportunities for all aspirants in the state.

In a landmark achievement, a team from the National Institute of Mountaineering and Adventure Sports (NIMAS), Arunachal Pradesh, has successfully summited Mt. Kangchenjunga on Sunday,

marking the successful conclusion of the 'Har Shikhar Tiranga' campaign. Led by Colonel Ranveer Singh Jamwal, the expedition became the only Indian team this season to record a 100% summit success rate on the third-highest mountain in the world. The campaign, which aimed to hoist the national flag atop the highest peak of all 28 Indian states, culminated with this ascent. The campaign also aimed at symbolizing unity and national pride through adventure.

The Meteorological Centre of Itanagar has forecast yellow alerts over 13 districts in the state. These districts are very likely to receive thunderstorms with lightning at isolated places over the next 24 hours. Additionally, an increase in rainfall activity over the state has also been predicted for 23rd to 26th of May.
