Prime Minister Narendra Modi today stated that Operation Sindoor has lent a new confidence and enthusiasm to the fight against terrorism across the world. Addressing the nation in his Mann Ki Baat programme on Akashvani, Mr Modi praised the valour displayed by armed forces during Operation Sindoor. He lauded the precision and accuracy with which armed forces destroyed the terrorist hideouts across the border. He said the whole country is united against terrorism today and filled with resolve to end it. The Prime Minister emphasized that Operation Sindoor is not just a military mission, but a picture of nation's resolve and courage.

Speaking about the recently organised Rising North East Summit, the Prime Minister said the North East is extraordinary. He mentioned Crafted Fibers, saying it is a beautiful confluence of Sikkim's tradition, the art of weaving, and fashion. Crafted Fibers was started by a person who is a Veterinary Doctor by profession.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi presided over the meeting of Chief Ministers and Deputy Chief Ministers of National Democratic Alliance ruled states in New Delhi today. The meeting was a day-long brainstorming session on good governance issues. BJP President Jagat Prakash Nadda, Home Minister Amit Shah, and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh also participated in the deliberations. Twenty Chief Ministers and 18 Deputy Chief Ministers belonging to all 20 NDA ruled governments discussed issues on good governance.

NITI Aayog CEO B.V.R. Subrahmayam has said that India has surpassed Japan to become the fourth-largest economy in the world. Briefing media in New Delhi yesterday after the Governing Council Meeting of NITI Aayog, Dr Subrahmanyam said that according to IMF data, India today is larger than Japan. He informed that India is the fourth largest economy and a four trillion-dollar economy. He expressed confidence that in a matter of another two to three years, India will become the third largest economy.

Joint Secretary, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Ajay Nagbhushan today visited FTI, Jote in Papum Pare district. He held a meeting with students, faculty members, officials and staff of the institute. Speaking to Prasara Bharati, the Joint Secretary said that facilities are being expanded in the country's third and North East's first Film and Television Institute. He informed that the progress of the pending works of the institute's building will be monitored every week at the ministry level. Shri Nagbhushan informed that instructions have been given to the project agencies to complete the work at a fast pace.

Two significant MoUs have been signed by the Department of Planning & Investment, Government of Arunachal Pradesh with investors, Medhavi Group and Farm Native Group at the Rising Northeast Investors Summit 2025 that concluded in Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi yesterday. Sharing the news in a social media post today, Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein informed that, the Medhavi Group will invest ₹178 crore to establish the Medhavi Skills, Innovation & Tribal Entrepreneurship University at Ziro while the Farm Native Group will set up a 250-bed Super Speciality Hospital in Arunachal with an investment of ₹150 crore.

Minister of RWD, Education, Tourism, Parliamentary Affairs, and Libraries, Pasang Dorjee Sona who is also the Guardian Minister of Namsai District, chaired a review meeting on various developmental works under central and state schemes yesterday. Namsai MLA, Chau Zingnu Namchoom, Secretary RD, PR, Dr. Sonal Swaroop who is also the Mentor Secretary of Namsai were in attendance among others.

Eight students - five girls and three boys - from the remote tribal regions of Sarli and Daporijo, successfully cleared the written entrance examination for Sainik Schools and the New Sainik School. This unprecedented milestone has been made possible through the concerted efforts of the Indian Army's Spear Corps. Launched under the aegis of the Spearhead Division; the Indian Army's eight-month intensive coaching program enrolled 33 students from border villages.

In a major initiative to promote higher education and support students across the state, the Department of Education, has released stipends for 8,501 students enrolled in various colleges and universities for the academic year 2024-25. This financial assistance

is provided under the Arunachal Pradesh Stipend Scheme, a fully state-funded program.

The Meteorological Centre of Itanagar has forecast yellow alerts over 13 districts in the state. These districts are very likely to receive thunderstorms with lightning at isolated places over the next 24 hours.
