President Droupadi Murmu today conferred Padma Awards to 68 eminent personalities for the year 2025 at the second Civil Investiture Ceremony held at Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi. Of them three were conferred with Padma Vibhushan, 9 with Padma Bhushan and 56 personalities were conferred with Padma Shri. Former Chief Justice of India Jagdish Singh Khehar and Kumudni Rajnikant Lakhia have been honoured with Padma Vibhushan for contribution in the field of Public Affairs and Arts while renowned folk singer Sharda Sinha was honoured with Padma Vibhushan posthumously. Those who have given Padma Bhushan include Jatin Goswami, Kailash Nath Dixit, Sadhvi Ritambhara while renowned economist Bibek Debroy was conferred with this prestigious award Posthumously.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi today said that recent events have proven that the so-called proxy war against India is, in fact, a well-planned war strategy.
