Prime Minister Narendra Modi, today, said that 1.4 billion Indians are united and working tirelessly to build a Viksit Bharat. Emphasizing self-reliance, Mr Modi said, it is the demand of the time that everything required to make India a developed nation, must be built within the country. Mr Modi was speaking after laying the foundation stone and inaugurating multiple development projects worth around 24,000 crore rupees at Dahod in Gujarat. Citing the rise in domestic manufacturing, he noted that Indian-made railway components are now exported to countries like England, France, Mexico, and Germany.

### **Byte: PM**

Speaking on Operation Sindoor, Prime Minister Modi said that it is not just a military action, but an expression of Indian values and emotions. On the occasion, Mr Modi also launched various development projects of the state government related to rail and other sectors. These include, Vande Bharat Express trains between Veraval and Ahmedabad and Express train between Valsad and Dahod stations.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has completed eleven years in office today, ushering in an era of stable governance and development. It was on this day in 2014 Mr Modi had taken oath as the Prime Minister of India. This marked a turning point in the country's modern political history as it had ended the era of coalition politics in India with people giving a clear and decisive mandate to the BJP.

India continued to expose Pakistan's re-pre-hen-sible design globally to support terrorism with multi-party delegations visiting various countries and spreading New Delhi's message of zero tolerance against the menace. An all-party delegation led by JD(U) MP Sanjay Kumar Jha, today, held interaction with think-tanks at Seoul in South Korea and highlighted that sponsoring terrorism has been the state policy of Pakistan since the last 40 years referring to

the Pahalgam terror attack. He added, the United Nation Security Council and the world should unite to fight terrorism.

Director General of the Indian Council of Medical Research Dr. Rajiv Bahal said that the Government is monitoring the COVID situation through the Integrated Disease Surveillance Program, which tracks COVID cases nationwide. Talking to the media, Dr. Bahal said that there is no cause for panic as of now due to the rising cases of COVID. He said, the severity of these cases remains low. However, he suggested the people to remain vigilant. Meanwhile, Delhi Health Minister Pankaj Singh has said that there is no reason to be afraid of Corona, as the variant is slowly developing like a virus.

External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar has pointed out that terrorist organizations are openly operating from the cities and towns of Pakistan. He said, terrorism is an open business in Pakistan that is supported, financed, and used by the Pakistani military and state. In an interview to a German Newspaper, Dr. Jaishankar said, India has sent a clear signal to the terrorists that price has to be paid by them for carrying out terrorist attacks. On India's retaliatory attacks after the Pahalgam terror attack, External Affairs Minister said, Indian strike was measured, and non-escalating.

The Government of Arunachal Pradesh has signed Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) worth over 6,000 crore rupees with 16 investors across diverse sectors during the two days Rising Northeast Investors Summit 2025 which was held at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi from May 23-24 last. The MoUs were signed between the Secretary, Planning & Investment, Government of Arunachal Pradesh and the representative of the investors in presence of the deputy chief minister, Chowna Mein, during the two-day investment summit.

Women and Child Development Minister, Dasanglu Pul, today undertook a visit to key cultural and administrative sites in Tezu, including the district museum, the under-construction community convention centre, and the CDPO's residential quarters. During her visit to the district museum, Pul was briefed by District Research Officer (DRO) J. Rondo on the existing challenges and developmental needs of the museum. She assured her ministry's full cooperation in addressing these issues.

The Meteorological Centre of Itanagar has forecast yellow alerts over 21 districts in the state. These districts are very likely to receive thunderstorms with lightning and heavy rain at isolated places over the next 24 hours. Additionally, the onset of the monsoon over the state has also been predicted as of today.

A free health camp was organised by NGO Siang Trust at Jeru village, Upper Siang district yesterday. A total of 85 patients were examined including senior citizens.
