Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that his government is committed to make India a sporting superpower ahead of Olympics 2036. In a video address to launch the 'Khelo India Youth Games 2025' yesterday, Mr Modi said, his government has increased the sports budget by three times over the past decade and allocated 4,000 crore rupees this year.
