India has reiterated its position that any India-Pakistan engagement has to be bilateral. Briefing media in New Delhi yesterday, External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said talks and terror cannot go together. He underlined that any bilateral discussion on Jammu and Kashmir will only be on the vacating of illegally occupied Indian territory by Pakistan. On the Indus Waters Treaty, the spokesperson said it will remain in abeyance until Pakistan credibly and irrevocably abjures its support for cross-border terrorism.

Replying to another query, the spokespersons said India expects Turkiye to strongly urge Pakistan to end its support to cross-border terrorism and take credible and verifiable actions against the terror ecosystem.



In a coordinated global outreach, multiple high-level Indian parliamentary delegations have embarked on visits to key nations. A multi-party delegation headed by JD(U) MP Sanjay Jha yesterday met Japanese Foreign Minister Takeshi Iwaya in Tokyo and requested Japan's support in the fight against terrorism. Mr Jha called for giving effect to the UN Security Council Press Statement of 25th April which underlined the need to hold perpetrators, organizers, financiers and sponsors of this reprehensible act of terrorism accountable and to bring them to justice. President Droupadi Murmu yesterday conferred six Kirti Chakras, including four posthumous, and 33 Shaurya Chakras, including seven posthumous, to the personnel of the Armed Forces, Central Armed Police Forces and State or Union Territory Police during Phase-I of the Defence Investiture Ceremony at Rashtrapati Bhawan. Kirti Chakra was posthumously presented to Rifleman Ravi Kumar, Colonel Manpreet Singh, Dy SP Himanyun Muzzammil Bhat, and Naik Dilwar Khan. Major Malla Rama Gopal Naidu of Maratha Light Infantry and Major Manjit of The Punjab Regiment were presented the Kirti Chakra.



Director General of Assam Rifles, Lt Gen Vikas Lakhera yesterday met with Nagaland Chief Minister Dr. Neiphiu Rio during his visit to Dimapur. He also visited Kashirambasti and conducted a comprehensive review of the operational readiness, ongoing activities, and challenges faced by the units under the Dimapur Sector. The visit focused on assessing the force's preparedness in maintaining internal security and regional stability in the Northeast. DG Lt Gen Lakhera interacted with the troops, commending their professionalism and dedication. He underscored the importance of heightened vigilance and strong civil-military cooperation to ensure lasting peace. The DG reaffirmed Assam Rifles' commitment to working closely with local communities to foster trust and support future operations.



A one-day sensitization programme on Child Rights was held yesterday for investigation and police officers under the Superintendent of Police (SP), Kohima. Organized by DEF, Kohima in collaboration with the Nagaland State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NSCPCR), the session focussed on equipping law enforcement personnel with a deeper understanding of child protection laws and procedures. SP, Kohima, Teisovise Metha, shared that the programme is designed to build the capacity of officers in handling cases involving children with greater sensitivity and legal awareness.

In his keynote address, Chairman, NSCPCR, Alun Hangsing, emphasised the growing need for stronger collaboration between the police department and NSCPCR to effectively address crimes against women and children. Mr Hangsing also pointed the importance of creating a child-friendly and non-intimidating environment during police interactions.



In response to the rising demand and widespread production of fruits and vegetables, even during the off-season, the Food Safety Authority under the Department of Health & Family Welfare, Nagaland, has launched a special drive across Mokokchung, Kohima, and Dimapur districts recently. The focus was on inspecting commercial distributors supplying to rural areas. As part of the initiative, Food Safety Officers conducted both survey and enforcement sampling. A total of 18 samples were collected and sent to various laboratories for analysis, while 28 on-the-spot adulteration tests were carried out by the Food Safety on Wheels team. The department stated that legal action will be taken against defaulters if any samples are found non-compliant once laboratory reports are received.
