Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be on a day-long visit to Madhya Pradesh today. On the occasion of 300th birth anniversary of Lokmata Devi Ahilya Bai Holkar, Mr Modi will participate in Lokmata Devi Ahilyabai Mahila Sashaktikaran Mahasammelan in Bhopal, and also inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of multiple development projects. Prime Minister will also inaugurate Datia and Satna Airports to boost last mile air connectivity in the region. Mr Modi will lay the foundation stone of ghat construction works worth over 860 crore rupees on Kshipra River.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has warned that if Pakistan carries out any terrorist act against India, it will have to face the consequences and suffer defeat. He said India will not hesitate and will use every method to root out the menace of terrorism. Mr. Singh was addressing officers and sailors onboard India's first indigenous aircraft carrier, INS Vikrant, off the Goa coast yesterday. The Defence Minister said, Operation Sindoor is not just a military action, but India's frontal assault against terrorism.

The Defence Minister called for the handing over of terrorists like Hafiz Saeed and Masood Azhar to India.

Mr Zeliang assured that the matter will be urgently taken up with NHIDCL to ensure immediate and comprehensive safety measures. He also reiterated the State Government's commitment to supporting the implementing agency and prioritizing commuter safety.
