Principal Secretary for Law & Justice, Y. Kikheto Sema, met with Union Minister for Law & Justice, Arjun Ram Meghwal, at New Delhi, to follow up on commitments made during the Minister's visits to Nagaland in October 2024 and April 2025. During the meeting, Mr. Sema requested an increase in the state's Notary Public quota from 200 to 400, citing outdated figures from 1963. Minister Meghwal assured that the proposal would be considered with an amendment expected within two months. He also raised the long-pending High Court building project, highlighting requirements of additional 299 crore rupees for the completion. Mr Meghwal said, the issue is under review by the Finance Ministry and expressed optimism for funding in the current financial year. Mr Sema further sought central support for new District Courts at Nuiland, Tseminyu, and Shamator, and early release of funds for ongoing projects in Mon, Noklak, and other districts. The Justice Ministry assured review under the SNA-SPARSH system for CSS fund disbursement.
