The Department of Industries & Commerce, Government of Nagaland, held a high-level meeting yesterday with a delegation from the Republic of Korea to explore avenues for collaboration in trade, investment, technology exchange, and capacity building. The meeting was led by Hekani Jakhalu, MLA and Advisor to the Department of Industries & Commerce, and attended by Director P. Tokugha Sema and senior officials. The Korean delegation was headed by Deputy Chief of Mission, Sang Woo Lim, and held at the Directorate of Industries & Commerce in Kohima.

The Commissioner of Police-cum-Foreigners Registration Officer, Dimapur has stated that foreign nationals must obtain a Protected Area Permit (PAP) before entering the state. The Protected Area regime, notified under the Foreigners (Protected Areas) Order, 1958, which was relaxed for the state of Nagaland had been withdrawn by the Ministry of Home Affairs in view of growing security concerns in

the border areas of the state. Therefore all foreigners who want to visit Nagaland will have to mandatorily obtain PAP from the concerned authorities as mandatorily register themselves with the Foreigners Registration Officer of the state or district they visit within 24 hours of their arrival. The proposed agitations of the five Tribes Committee on Review of Reservation Policy will commence today, following the government's letter failed to address the concerns and issues raised in their memorandum. In a press statement, the Committee stated, that state government had requested the five Tribes Committee on Review of Reservation Policy to re-consider the proposed agitation stating that it had constituted a committee on May 7 to examine and submit its findings on Policy for Reservation in Government employment within three months. The five Tribes committee in consultation with the five tribe apex bodies came to a unanimous decision that the state government letter not only lacks sincere commitment but fails to address the core issues.
