India and Pakistan have agreed to stop firing and military action with immediate effect. Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri made an announcement in this regard in New Delhi. He said that the Pakistan Director General of Military Operation initiated the call for ceasfire this afternoon after which discussions took place and understanding reached. External Affairs Ministry clarified that the stoppage of firing and military action was worked out directly between the two countries. It added that there is no decision to hold talks on any other issue at any other place.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi today held a meeting with Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and three services Chiefs. NSA Ajit Doval also attended the meeting. The meeting took place at his residence in the National Capital amid India's retaliatory action against Pakistan.



Indian Armed Forces have carried out precision strike on Pakistan military targets, including technical infrastructure, command and control centre, radar sites and weapon storage areas in retaliation to Islamabad's escalatory and provocative actions. In a special briefing on Operation Sindoor, Wing Commander Vyomika Singh elaborated on the details of the actions taken by the Armed Forces.

Colonel Sofiya Qureshi informed that the Pakistani army is continuously attacking the western borders by using drones, long-range weapons, loitering munitions and fighter jets. She said, India effectively neutralized the attacks.

Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said, it is a Pakistani act that constituted provocation and escalation and in response to Pakistani actions, India responded in a measured way. The Foreign Secretary emphasized that Pakistan continues with its execrable and wanton campaign of targeting civilians and civilian infrastructure, especially in the states of Jammu and Kashmir and Punjab.



The government has issued an advisory to all media channels to refrain from using Civil Defence Air Raid Sirens sounds in their programs other than community awareness drives. The Ministry of Home Affairs in its statement said that the routine use of sirens may likely reduce the sensitivity of civilians towards the air raid sirens, and civilians may misunderstand it as a routine matter during the actual air raids.

The stretch, covering 21.9 km from Chakhabama to Kikruma village, is being executed under Engineering, Procurement, and Construction mode by Ratna Infrastructure Projects Private Limited.
