These aquaparks are conceptualized as integrated hubs that offer services ranging from hatcheries and feed mills to cold storage, processing, training, and marketing, all under one roof. The event will also be attended by Minister of State Fisheries Animal Husbandry and Dairying George Kurian. The Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, in a statement, informed that on this occasion, certificates and sanction orders will be distributed to various beneficiaries.

FIR:

Manipur Police has registered an FIR against Paojakhup Guite, President Kuki Students Organisation Delhi with regards to a video footage circulating on social media in the last couple of days. The student leader, a strong advocate of Kuki rights, was seen addressing a street gathering asking for maximum restriction to the movement of Meitei community who will be travelling through Kuki dominated areas for participating in the State Shirui Festival at Ukhrul District. Manipur Police in a social media said, the FIR was registered at Churachandpur Police Station, and all the adjoining district police have also been informed about the lookout. The Police of neighbouring States of Mizoram, Assam, Nagaland and Meghalaya have been requested to arrest him.

The BSF Wives Welfare Association, Sector Tura, celebrated Mother's Day at the District Auditorium in Tura yesterday. Smt. Puneet Sharma, wife of The DIG of Sector HQ BSF Tura, Shri Lalit Mohan Sharma along with fellow commandant's wives attended the programme. MEDICAL COLLEGE:

Meghalaya Government plans to increase the number of medical seats to 450 over the next two years, in addition to the 100 seats provided to the state's students under the central quota, Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma said. The Shillong Medical College will commence its MBBS programme this year, while the Tura Medical College is expected to launch its course next year, he said. The PA Sangma International Medical College and Hospital at the University of Science and Technology Meghalaya (USTM) has already started its MBBS programme, Sangma stated. With around 100-150 seats available in these three institutes, and around 100 seats available from the central quota, the total number of available seats for students from the state will rise to around 550, the chief minister said. Shillong Medical College is expected to be operational by September 2025, and Tura Medical College by 2026-2027.

INAUGURATION:
