NEWS IN ORDER:-

VICE PRESIDENT

Vice President, Jagdeep Dhankhar has described the North East, a jewel of the country while addressing members of Self Help Groups from Meghalaya in New Delhi yesterday. A delegation of 30 Self-Help Group women members from Meghalaya met the Vice President at his official residence in New Delhi. The visit was led by Meghalaya Chief Minister, Conrad K Sangma, as part of his ongoing initiative to empower grassroots women leaders and provide them with national exposure. During the interaction, the Vice President lauded the state's efforts in strengthening women's collectives and acknowledged the transformational progress being made in the state. He noted that the state's focus on women empowerment, improved nutrition, and maternal health outcomes was exemplary. The Vice President highlighted the progress made under 'Look East, Act East' policy. He said that the state has enormous talents, potential in tourism, mining, IT, service sector among others.

CABINET

The Arunachal Pradesh cabinet held its meeting at Kibithu, the last outpost along the Indo-China (Tibet) border in Anjaw district yesterday. Chaired by Chief Minister Pema Khandu, the cabinet took several decisions during the historical cabinet meeting at Kibithu, India's first village. The formation of a Joint Venture Company, 'M/s NEEPCO Arunachal Hydro Power Corporation Limited' between the State Government and NEEPCO was approved for implementing five hydro power projects - Tato I, Heo, Tato II, Naying and Hirong in Shi-Yomi district. To bring equitable and rational distribution of teachers and non-ministerial employees across govt schools, the Cabinet also approved the revised Teachers' Transfer and Posting Policy, 2025. The Cabinet also approved to empower Deputy Commissioners to suspend erring District Officials under specific circumstances. In order to pave way for immediate recruitment of teachers to plug the gap in subject teachers in schools, the cabinet has approved the framing of "Marking Scheme for Direct Recruitment to the post of Post Graduate Teachers and Trained Graduate Teachers, Rules, 2025."

CONSTABLE

In Manipur, the mortal remains of Border Security Force constable, Deepak Chingakham, who was killed in the line of duty during Operation Sindoor in Kharkhola BOP in R.S. Pura Sector of Jammu Region reached Imphal and the last rites were performed yesterday. He was given a guard of honour by the security personnel and a wreath laying ceremony was held at Bir Tikendrajit International Airport in Imphal. Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla, MPs- Leishemba Sanajaoba, Angomcha Bimol Akoijam, MLAs, top civil and security officers and others attended the wreath laying ceremony. Later, the body was taken to his native village- Yairipok Yamber in Thoubal district where the last rites were performed. Chingabam attached to 7th BSF Battalion sustained injuries in drone attack while on duty in the intervening night of 9th and 10th of this month and succumbed to injuries. He joined BSF in 2021.

SIKKIM

In Sikkim, the Press Club of Sikkim in collaboration with the Information and Public Relations Department, Government of Sikkim organized a Golden Jubilee Conclave at Gangtok yesterday. The first session was graced by the Governor of Sikkim, Om Prakash Mathur who stated that since 2014, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Government of India has taken many steps to improve the North-East and border areas. Welcoming the journalists, scholars, and policymakers, he stated that their ideas would support the State’s vision for a “sunaulo samriddha ani samarth sikkim”.

WEATHER

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast heavy to very heavy rainfall conditions at isolated places over Assam and Meghalaya today. The weather agency has predicted heavy rainfall over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, Assam and Meghalaya during the next three days. The met department estimated isolated to scattered light to moderate rainfall accompanied by thunderstorm, lightning and gusty winds over Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, West Bengal, Sikkim, and Bihar during the next three days. According to the IMD, East Uttar Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand are expected to witness heat wave conditions today.

RESULTS

The Central Board of Secondary Education has declared the results for both Class 12 and Class 10 examinations. In Class 12, 88.39 per cent of students have passed, marking an increase of 0.41 percent over last year. Girls have outperformed boys by 5.94 percent, with over 91 percent passing the exam. A total of 16 lakh 92 thousand 794 students had appeared for the examinations this year. Meanwhile in Class 10, 93.66 per cent of students have passed the board exams an increase of 0.06 percent from last year. Girls have again outshone boys by 2.37 percentage points, with 95 per cent of them passing. A total of 23 lakh 71 thousand 939 students had appeared for the class 10 board examinations this year.
