The Northeast National Service Scheme (NSS) Festival 2025 officially began at, Rüsoma Village, Kohima yesterday. The event is being hosted by the NSS Cell under the Directorate of Youth Resources & Sports, Government of Nagaland, in collaboration with the Regional Directorate of NSS, Guwahati, and sponsored by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India. Themed "Viksit Bharat,"the week-long festival brings together 300 volunteers from across eight northeastern states. Railways Ministry has said that only those users will be able to book online tatkal tickets through IRCTC website and app from 1st of next month who have authenticated their account with Aadhar. V/C- Indian Railways has announced key modifications in the tatkal ticket booking system. According to the new scheme, aadhaar-based OTP authentication will be mandatory for online tatkal bookings from 15th of July this year. Tatkal tickets booked at computerised Passenger Reservation System counters and through authorised agents will require OTP authentication sent to the mobile number provided by the user at the time of booking. These changes are being implemented to improve transparency in Tatkal bookings and to ensure that the benefits of the scheme reach genuine end users.
